Important Program Info

Registrations

- Program registration opens on Wednesday, August 6 at 8am at GetYourGirlPower.org.
- Program registration closes on the specified deadline or when maximum numbers have been reached. A late fee of 25% of the program fee will be assessed if your late registration is accepted after the closing date. Free events will incur a \$3 late fee. Late registration may not be accepted if an event is full or other circumstances prevent additional registrations.
- All registrations must be made online to guarantee your spot in the program.
- Confirmations will be emailed 1 week prior to each session. We must have a valid email address for confirmations!
- To be added to the wait list for a full program, please call Customer Care at 888-623-1237.
- Cookie Dough or Nutty Bucks may be used for payment. Registration will not be complete and spots will not be held until Customer Care is contacted to complete payment.

Cancellations & Refunds

- If the event or session does not meet the minimum registration by the deadline date, GSCI reserves the right to cancel the event with refunds to the payee of the event in the same form as payment. If payment was Cookie Dough/Nutty Bucks, refunds will be given in the form of program credit to be used within 60 days of issued program credit.
- In the case of extreme weather, an event may be cancelled or rescheduled. If the event is cancelled, refunds will be given to the payee of the event in the same form as payment. No refunds will be given for any registrant who arrives late, leaves early, attends only part of the event or chooses not to attend the event.
- The leader or parent/caregiver must cancel the event registration 6 weeks prior to the event date in order to receive a refund. The refund will be refunded with the same payment type.
- A refund may be possible if there is a documented medical/emergency situation, and a request form is submitted within one week after the event date.
- Members who register as non-members will not be able to request a refund for the difference in pricing. If members have issues registering, please contact Customer Care to ensure you are registering correctly.

General

- Troops are responsible for collecting permission slips and meeting girl-to-adult ratios, unless program is noted as a drop off event.
- Girls registering individually must attend with an adult unless program is noted as a drop off event.
- If you are attending a family event and a sibling or friend will be participating in the event, please register that additional child.
- If the family event is overnight, males can only sleep in quarters with other males or with their family.
- Tagalongs (unregistered siblings or friends) are not allowed at programs or events unless otherwise stated or prior permission is given by the staff member facilitating the program. Many programs have capacity numbers due to space or restriction from community partners or it may be deemed unsafe or distracting to have younger children present. If tagalongs attend, facilitators have the right to ask that they leave. No refunds will be issued if this causes the Girl Scout to be unable to stay due to no longer having their adult present to meet ratio.







Bronze. Silver. Gold. These represent the highest honors Girl Scouts can earn as Juniors, Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors. All three awards give girls the chance to do big things while working on an issue that's captured their interest in a big way. Whether they want to plant a community garden at school and inspire others to eat healthy for the Bronze, advocate for animal rights for the Silver, or build a career network that encourages girls to become scientists and engineers for the Gold, they'll inspire others (and themselves).

The first step for a girl interested in earning her highest award is participating in an Award Chat. Award Chats will discuss the guidelines for earning the Bronze, Silver, and Gold Awards. The chats will be hosted as a go-to meeting, which will consist of a PowerPoint training that outlines the guidelines, paperwork, and deadlines. It will also include a question-and-answer opportunity, so troop leaders, parents and girls will feel more confident in their journey towards these awards. These virtual chats will be 30-minutes long. Please note: Attending an awards chat or scheduling a 1:1 chat is required for all Girl Scouts to earn their Silver or their Gold Award. Register for all Highest Award Chats two days before it occurs at the latest.

- · By attending the training, you are agreeing to facilitate at least 4 programs each year.
- · Lodging can be provided if needed during the two days of the training.
- · Most of the outdoor adventure requests are on weekends.
- Challenge Course Facilitators must be able to stand for extended period of time, lift 50 or more pounds for short durations, climb a few feet up the climbing wall, complete the challenge course in a reasonable amount of time if doing the full course, be able to see and hear well enough to monitor participants who may be 50 or more feet away, communicate clearly with other facilitators and participants, climb multiple flights of stairs, balance on the course, and be reasonably comfortable with heights (if doing high course).
- The weight and height minimums and maximums for a facilitator are being between 4'8 and 6'3 tall and 250lbs or below. Those under 5'0 may find some parts of the high ropes course and zip line particularly challenging. Those not meeting height/weight requirements may become a ground- only facilitator. Any concerns in regards to the physical requirements or conditions that may affect your ability to participate or require accommodations should be discussed with council staff prior to the start of training.
- Facilitators receive a stipend of \$10/hour for facilitating challenge course activities. The time of the challenge course activities can range from 2-3 hours and at times you may facilitate multiple activities in one day.


