



FAQs for Zoom Licenses for GSCI Troop and SU Leaders

What is the process for purchasing a GSUSA Zoom license?

Go to the [Events Calendar](#) at www.getyourgirlpower.org; choose Zoom licenses for GSCI Troop and SU Leaders. You will be able to review all of the **GSUSA & Zoom conditions** for use of the Zoom licenses, choose register, and enter the email that will be attached to the zoom account. Pay the \$36 fee and within 2-3 weeks, you will receive an email from Zoom with all of your license information along with how to get started. What is the cost and length of the GSUSA Zoom License?

The Zoom license costs \$36 for one year at the time of activation.

Do I have to be a Girl Scout member?

Yes, this license is to help troop and SU leaders to communicate with their troop members and leaders during the COVID restrictions. It is for Girl Scout use only.

How many licenses can a troop purchase?

This offer is limited to one license per troop.

Can the license be transferred?

If a leader leaves the organization another leader from the troop can be made the administrator by writing to customercare@girlscouts-gsci.org to request a change. We cannot give refunds for any licenses that are not used.

What do I need to know before using the license?

We are asking every leader purchasing the license to read the [GSUSA Zoom End User Agreement](#), read the [Safety Activity Checkpoint on Virtual Meetings](#) and have the girls sign the [Internet Safety Pledge](#).

Is there any time limit on the length of the meetings?

Since this is not a free license, you have an unlimited time on your meeting. But remember, keep the meetings consistent with the age level attention span. The best amount of time for Daisies is 30-45 minutes, Brownies 45-60 minutes, Juniors and above 1-1 ½ hours.

What do I need to know about creating a meeting for my troop in Zoom?

When you are creating a meeting, many of the safety issues are locked, but one that is automatically checked is "enable to enter before host". Please uncheck that box. Also remember, we don't record sessions in Zoom for the protection of the children. All of this and more is covered in the [Safety Activity Checkpoint on Virtual Meetings](#).
